







LET'S GET CRAFTY! WITH CHICKEN FRANK, DINOSAUR!

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

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9-inch white paper plates chenille stems/pipe cleaners - yellow or orange craft beady eyes (with sticker backs, if possible) construction paper - red, yellow or orange craft fluff feathers craft glue, scissors, and tape

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Fold paper plate in half. Do not smooth ribbing or curved shape.
- 2. For the "comb" and "wattles," cut 2 hearts from red paper to a length of 3.5 in. and 2 in.
- 3. From the center point of the larger heart, make a cut half-way to the center, as shown. This will allow the "comb" to be slipped into place on the plate.
- 4. To make beak, cut a 1 3/4-inch square from yellow paper. Then from the center point of one side, cut an equilateral triangle to yield two smaller triangles, as shown.
- 5. To create the upper beak, glue one of the smaller triangles on top of the equilateral triangle, as shown.
- 6. Slip comb into place and glue to underside of plate. Glue beak into place at underside of plate. For the wattle, invert the small heart and glue to underside of plate, as shown.
- 7. Glue eye into place.
- 8. Choose wing and tail feathers. Spread glue on plate for feathers and attach as desired.
- 9. Bend 2 chenille stems to create 2 chicken feet and tape into pace on underside of plate.
- 10. Enjoy!
